MURKONG SELEK COLLEGE, JONAI – AT A GLANCE

Murkong Selek College, located in the Jonai Co-District of Assam near the border of Arunachal Pradesh, is the premier institution of higher education in this rural and tribal region. Established in 1984, it was the first college in Jonai, founded through the collective efforts and vision of the local people to promote higher education in an educationally backward area.

Jonai Sub-Division, created in 1979 from the erstwhile Murkong Selek area, has played a crucial role in shaping the region’s identity. With a population of around two lakhs, predominantly from the Mising community, the establishment of the college significantly contributed to educational and social upliftment. In 2023, Jonai was upgraded to a Co-District, enhancing its administrative importance and developmental scope.

The name “Murkong Selek” originates from the Mising language, where ‘Murkong’ means money or silver and ‘Selek’ refers to land covered with thatching grass or reeds. Local folklore connects the name to scattered coins left behind during historical invasions, symbolizing prosperity and cultural heritage.

From modest beginnings, the college has grown into a well-established institution with a 15-acre campus, modern infrastructure, and a conducive academic environment. It is affiliated with Dibrugarh University and was recognized under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act in 1999. The college offers undergraduate programs in various disciplines along with distance education courses under Dibrugarh University and Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University.

With facilities such as a well-equipped library, digital classrooms, internet access, sports infrastructure, and student amenities, the college supports both academic and holistic development. Accredited by NAAC with a ‘C’ grade in 2015, it currently serves more than 1000 students as a co-educational institution.

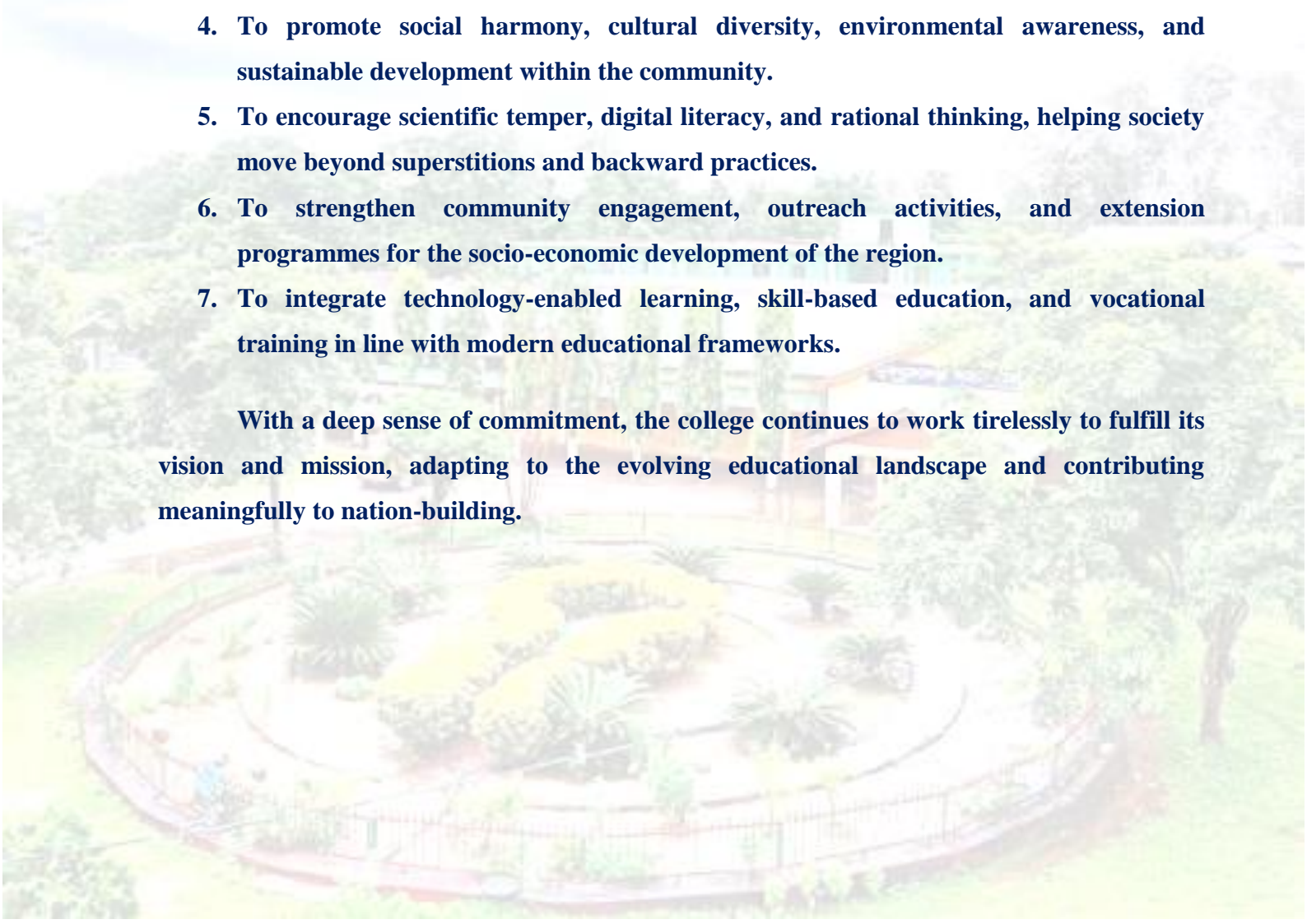
Vision:

2. DEGREE ADMISSION (FYUGP – NEP 2020)

Admissions for BA/BSc under **Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)** are conducted via the **SAMARTH Portal**.

Registration for students seeking admission into Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes and Five-Year Integrated Master's Programmes for the academic year 2026–27 shall commence from 4:00 PM on 11th April, 2026 onwards through the Assam State Higher Education Admission Portal: <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/index.php/site/login>

The admission process shall be carried out in the following two steps:

Step 1: Registration of students on the portal and completion of their profile starting from 11th April, 2026 (4:00 PM onwards).

Step 2: Selection of preferred institutions and programmes by students after the declaration of Class XII results. (Step 1 shall remain open even after the commencement of Step 2.)

Applicants are required to register and create their accounts through the portal using their own mobile number and email ID (all future communications regarding admission shall be made only through the applicant's registered mobile number and email ID of applicants) . It may be noted that registration on the portal is completely free of cost. Students may be encouraged to link their APAAR ID during registration. Those who do not already have an APAAR ID may be advised to create the same before registering.

Details regarding the documents required for registration are available on the portal. Applicants are advised to refer to the instructions in the Portal regarding the registration process. Students may be advised to keep all necessary documents ready for uploading in due course.

Being an affiliated college of Dibrugarh University, Murkong Selek College follows the Dibrugarh University regulations of BA/B.Sc programme of eight semester degree course for four year duration. Dibrugarh University is introducing (FYGUP) at undergraduate level.

ATTENDANCE

Students admitted into the college must bear in mind that a minimum of 85% attendance in the class register is mandatory. Any student's attendance falling short of this requirement will not be considered as a regular student and will be subjected to subsequent disciplinary actions as per college rule.

NOTE FOR THE STUDENTS

- Students are required to go through the prospectus carefully
- Prospectus and forms can be collected from the college office on payment of Rs. 100/- only
- Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed form within the stipulated date.
- No application will be entertained after the stipulated date.
- Students will be admitted on the basis of merit.
- Student must have 85% attendance in the classroom during the academic session.
- Candidates shall have to produce their original certificate at the time of admission.
- Students intending to change his/her subject (BA course/HS course) must obtain necessary permission from the Principal within one month of his/her admission in to the college.
- A Student seeking transfer shall apply to the Principal along with the clearance certificate from the following :
 - ❖ Library clearance certificate
 - ❖ Fees clearance certificate
 - ❖ Hostel clearance certificate.
- Candidate can be directly admitted to B.A./B.Sc. 2nd semester, provided such a candidate should produce Migration certificate that should be forwarded by the University authority and also the candidate should obtain pass certificate and Marks sheet of B.A./B.Sc. 1st semester final examination from the institution last attended.
- Students of ST, SC, OBC and MOBC are advised to apply for scholarship on prescribed forms obtainable from the college office along with their respective caste certificate.

SUPPORT SERVICES

LIBRARY

The Murkong Selek college library is one of the best equipped libraries not only of Jonai Sub-Division but also of the Dhemaji District. The library is equipped with INFLIBNET facility. The library is completely computerized with a present holding of approx. 10,150 text books on various subjects, 15 nos. of journals, 10 nos. of other magazines and 5 nos. of daily news papers. The Library also provides e-journals. The library also provides reference section which houses the journals, encyclopedias, dictionaries, past question papers of the university examinations and other books for reference purposes. The library has separate premises of its own. It contains minimum infrastructure facilities such as staff support, reading hall, book section circulation counter, service areas etc. There is a Library Advisory Committee to maintain and promote library services.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **The Students are to contact the Librarian for obtaining Library Card.**
- **At a time, only two books will be issued from a single card.**
- **Books are issued to Students only for fifteen days. Delay of the submission of the books to Library would invite a fine of one rupee each day thereafter.**
- **Students have to handle the books carefully. They have to pay the exact price of the book if they damage or lose the same.**
- **If anyone loses the Library Card he/she has to apply to the Librarian for duplicate card.**
- **Students have to deposit Caution Money to the Librarian. The Caution Money will be refunded on completion of his/her period or at the time of leaving the College after deducting the value of damage or loss caused by him/her to the College Library property. A Student shall be liable to compensate the cost, if the value of damaged or lost property exceeds the amount of their Caution Money.**

HOSTEL FACILITIES:

Murkong Selek College provides hostel accommodation to support students coming from distant and rural areas. The hostels are designed to offer a safe, comfortable, and disciplined living environment conducive to academic pursuits.

The college hostel is equipped with basic amenities such as well-ventilated rooms, adequate lighting, clean drinking water, and sanitation facilities. Emphasis is given to maintaining cleanliness, hygiene, and security within the hostel premises.

Supervision is ensured by a Hostel Warden, who looks after the welfare and discipline of the boarders. The college also encourages a cooperative and friendly atmosphere among students, promoting a sense of community living.

Limited hostel seats at nominal rates are available for both boys and girls. Hostels are well furnished with 24 hours running water and electricity facilities. The girls' hostel has an accommodation capacity of 48 students with well protected brick wall around it. The Boys' hostel has a capacity of 12 seats at present.

EVALUATION OF STUDENTS

Murkong Selek College follows a student-centric and continuous evaluation system in accordance with the National Education Policy 2020 and the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP). The college is affiliated with Dibrugarh University and strictly adheres to the evaluation guidelines prescribed by the University.

The evaluation process includes a combination of continuous Internal Assessment (IA) and End-Semester Examinations. Internal assessment comprises sessional tests, assignments, seminars, project work, class participation, and attendance, ensuring regular monitoring of student progress.

The system emphasizes outcome-based learning, skill development, and application of knowledge, in line with NEP 2020 reforms. Transparency, fairness, and timely feedback are maintained throughout the process, with provisions for grievance redressal and re-evaluation as per university norms.

This comprehensive evaluation framework ensures the holistic development of students, assessing both academic performance and overall competencies.

INTERNET FACILITIES

The college provides free Wi-Fi facilities to students within the college campus to support academic and learning activities. The internet service enables students to access online study materials, e-resources, digital libraries, and educational platforms.

The facility promotes ICT-based learning, research, and communication, helping students stay updated with modern educational practices. The college ensures that the network is accessible in key areas to facilitate a technology-enabled learning environment.

XEROX FACILITIES

The college also provides Xerox facility for staff and Students at minimum cost.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The college has introduced National Service Scheme (NSS) under Dibrugarh University. The NSS unit has 100 volunteers and one of the Teachers of the college designated as Programme Officer.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Murkong Selek College aims to develop the personality and character of students through community service and social engagement. Functioning under the guidelines of the National Service Scheme, the unit encourages students to actively participate in nation-building activities.

The NSS unit organizes various programs such as cleanliness drives, tree plantation, health awareness campaigns, rural development activities, and special camps. These initiatives help students cultivate values of social responsibility, leadership, and teamwork.

Through NSS, students gain practical experience, develop a sense of civic duty, and contribute positively to society, reflecting the motto: *“Not Me, But You.”*

Seminars, conference, workshops etc. are the essential programmes for faculty development. They are integral part of teaching-learning process. The college conducts National seminars, workshops & other personality development programmes. Resource persons from various fields are invited for such programmes.

STUDENT WELFARE SCHEMES

- **Academic Merit Award** : A cash prize of Rs. 5000 and a certificate of merit is being awarded by the HoD, History, annually since 2025-2026 to the students securing the highest aggregate marks in the History Department in the Final University Examination.
- **Drinking water facility** : The College provides safe and adequate drinking water facilities to ensure the health and well-being of its students and staff. The college campus is equipped with clean and hygienic water supply points at convenient locations for easy access.

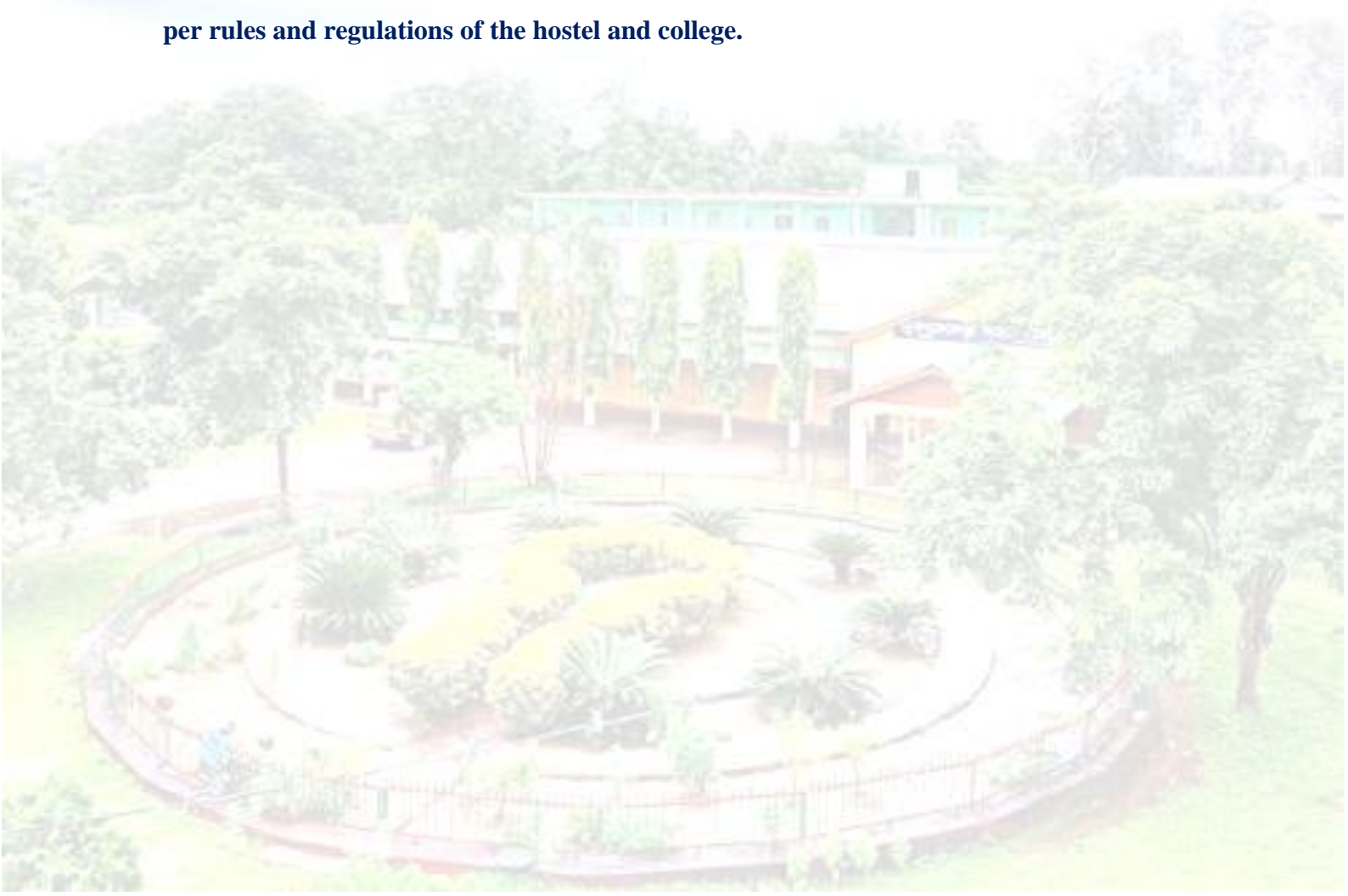
- 2) Students must be regular and punctual in attending their classes.**
